Persia, Southern Desert, Iraq, Northern Kurdistan, Palestine, Bomb and Mine Clearance 1945-49, Palestine 1945-48, Bomb and Mine Clearance 1945-56, Malaya, S.E. Brigadier Eric BRICKMAN, DSO, born 1900, died 1985
 Appears to have joined the Cameronians either late in the war or after hostilities ceased. Became Commanding Officer 2nd Battalion The Cameronians (Scottish Rifles) 1941 to 1952 when he retired. Obviously a career officer. Married. Elder daughter Jean Maxwell Brickman (born 1936 Lucknow) engaged to Stephen John Younger in 1958. Younger daughter Flora MacDonald Brickman engaged to Ross Harvey in 1969 (then stated to be of Denork, St Andrews, Fife).
