He fought in the South African War before joining the King's African Rifles, 1905-1907. He explored Northern Arabia, 1907- 1908, disguised as a Bedouin, and lectured to the Royal Geographical Society on his return. He transferred to the South Staffordshire Regimen in 1908, then the Egyptian Army, 1909-1915. During World War One he served with the Egyptian Expeditionary Force, 1914-1915, saw action in the Dardanelles, 1915-1916 and in France, 1916-1918, and held the position of Deputy Chief of Intelligence, CHO, 1918. From 1919 to 1920 he worked as Head of Naval Intelligence, Constantinople. He held a non- commissioned post in India, 1921-1923 and was Military Attache, Bucharest, 1923-1926.
