The father is the enigma in this family - for what reason does an Anglican Clergyman go to China to work as a Schoolmaster in a Jewish School? He appears to have left for China the year before his son was KIA. No evidence of his wife joining him there.

I've checked the newspapers but no clues concerning his career in either Jamaica, South Africa or China, and no reports of his death.

He (the father) did have twin sisters Annie & Agnes (younger) one of whom may have worked as a Missionary in China.
