Mr William Holms, 38 Sardinia Terrace, Glasgow, has received a telegram from the military authorities informing him that his elder son, Second Lieutenant William Holms, HLI, has been killed in action. Lieutenant Holms, who was only 19 years of age, was educated at Glasgow Acamemy and Speir's School, Beith. He had recently begun his training in engineering at Messrs. Yarrows (Limited), Scotstoun. He was for eight months in the Inns of Court O.T.C., London, was gazetted last July, and sent to the front on 5th September.
