Jury, of Glenelg, have received news of the death of their son, Lieutenant B. E. F. Jury, who was killed in action in France. Lieutenant Jury, who was born at Glenelg, was 21 years of age. He received his early education at the Rev. D. Kerr's grammar school, Glenelg, which was afterwards in charge of the Rev. W. Moore. Subsequently he went to St. Peter's College, and was then employed by the firm of G. & R. Wills and Co., of which his father is a director. He left for England in August, 1915, and received his commission as lieutenant in the 7th Battalion of the London Regiment. [ <i>The Advertiser</i> , 30 September 1916]

**Kathleen Rischbieth JURY**, born 4 July 1897, Glenelg. Unable to locate DOD but is buried St Jude's Cemetery, Brighton SA. Married Harry Richmond Aldridge. He petitioned for divorce in 1938 on the grounds his wife had deserted him. Her husband was given custody of their son, Eliot Richmond ALDRIDGE, who married Jocelyn NANKIVELL in SA, 1952.

**Margaret Rischbieth JURY**, born 23 September 1900, Glenelg, SA. Died 1972 Perth. Did not marry.  
In 1949 she was living at 40 View Street, Cottesloe, WA. In 1968 she was living at 27 Leake Street, Peppermint Grove, WA. Appears to have spent much of her life in WA with her Uncle & Aunt (Mr H. W. & Bessie Rischbieth, OBE).

**Elizabeth Rischbieth JURY**, born 19 December 1904, New Glenelg, died 13 April 1954. Married Gordon d'Arcy WAINWRIGHT. No known children. Her husband remarried and had 2 children from his second marriage - David Gordon Arthur, 1956, and Janet Kathleen, 1960.

**General Notes:**

"His Father was George Arthur, a merchant, and mother Elizabeth Susan, nee Rischbieth. 1 of 5 children. His brother Charles Rischbieth became a famous poet (in Aust Dict of Bio). GRJ 2nd Lt 1/7th London TF Regiment (The Shiny Seventh). Died 14/9/1916, no grave."

**Ernest August Rischbieth**, of High Street, Glenelg, died at the North Adelaide Private Hospital on Monday afternoon, following upon an illness of about three weeks' duration. Mr. Rischbieth was well known in business circles in Adelaide. He was a son of the late Mr. Charles Rischbieth, of G. & R. Wills & Co., and was born at Glenelg 34 years ago. He was educated at Prince Alfred College and at Clifton College, England. Mr. Rischbieth entered into business in Adelaide about 17 years ago, being first connected with the firm of George Wills & Co., and latterly with the warehouse of G. & R. Wills & Co., of which he has been a director since 1913. He was married about six months ago to the eldest daughter of Mr. F. Lathlean. He was a brother of Mr. C. F. Rischbieth, of Glenelg, Mr. H. W. Rischbieth, of Western Australia, Dr. Harold Rischbieth, of North Adelaide, Mrs. G. A. Jury and Miss E. G. Rischbieth, of Glenelg, and Mrs L.G. Stock, of Adelaide.
