[Captain K. M. Mylne] He went on to write the history of the Regiment: Captain K. M. Mylne, *The History of the Worcestershire Regiment: a lecture to recruits*, pp. 32. Worcester, 1918. His interest in his father's involvement in liturgical renewal can be seen in his later publication under the name Fra Ascensione: *Liturgia anglicana. Anglice et latine ... and Liturgia scotica anglice et latine, Fra Ascensione*: [Edinburgh,] 1962, pp. 88. The name may be a joke – it sounds like a medieval friar's name, but at the same time refers to 'la domenica fra Ascensione e Pentecoste' on the Christian Liturgical Year. There is also a Brentano-designed Anglican 'Church of the Ascension' at Cadenabbia on the English resort site of Lake Como.
